1.0 Introduction

This program directory is intended for system programmers who are responsible for program installation and maintenance. It contains information about the material and procedures associated with the installation of IBM IMS Transaction and Database Servers, 15.03.00. This publication refers to IBM IMS Transaction and Database Servers, 15.03.00 as IMS V15.03.00.

The Program Directory contains the following sections:

- 2.0, “Program Materials” on page 4 identifies the basic program materials and documentation for IMS V15.03.00.
- 3.0, “Program Support” on page 9 describes the IBM support available for IMS V15.03.00.
- 4.0, “Program and Service Level Information” on page 11 lists the APARs (program level) and PTFs (service level) that have been incorporated into IMS V15.03.00.
- 5.0, “Installation Requirements and Considerations” on page 12 identifies the resources and considerations that are required for installing and using IMS V15.03.00.
- 6.0, “Installation Instructions” on page 23 provides detailed installation instructions for IMS V15.03.00. It also describes the procedures for activating the functions of IMS V15.03.00, or refers to appropriate publications.

Before installing IMS V15.03.00, read the *CBPDO Memo To Users* and the *CBPDO Memo To Users Extension* that are supplied with this program in softcopy format and this program directory; after which, keep the documents for your reference. Section 3.2, “Preventive Service Planning” on page 9 tells you how to find any updates to the information and procedures in this program directory.

IMS V15.03.00 is supplied in a Custom-Built Product Delivery Offering (CBPDO, 5751-CS3). The program directory that is provided in softcopy format on the CBPDO is identical to the hardcopy format if one was included with your order. All service and HOLDDATA for IMS V15.03.00 are included on the CBPDO.

Do not use this program directory if you install IMS V15.03.00 with a SystemPac or ServerPac. When you use one of those offerings, use the jobs and documentation supplied with the offering. The offering will point you to specific sections of this program directory as needed.

Before you install IMS V15.03.00, make sure that you have reviewed the current Preventive Service Planning (PSP) information. Review the PSP Bucket for General Information, Installation Documentation, and the Cross Product Dependencies sections. For the Recommended Service section, instead of reviewing the PSP Bucket, it is recommended you use the IBM.PRODUCTINSTALL-REQUIREDSERVICE fix category in SMP/E to ensure you have all the recommended service installed. Use the **FIXCAT(IBM.PRODUCTINSTALL-REQUIREDSERVICE)** operand on the **APPLY CHECK** command. See 6.1.12, "Perform SMP/E APPLY" on page 29 for a sample APPLY command

If you obtained IMS V15.03.00 as part of a CBPDO, HOLDDATA is included.

4.0 Program and Service Level Information

This section identifies the program and relevant service levels of IMS V15.03.00. The program level refers to the APAR fixes that have been incorporated into the program. The service level refers to the PTFs that have been incorporated into the program.

4.1 Program Level Information

Refer to the PSP Facility for IMS V15.03.00 APAR information.

4.2 Service Level Information

PTFs containing APAR fixes against this release of IMS V15.03.00 have been incorporated into this product package. For a list of included PTFs, examine the ++VER statement in the product's SMPMCS.

Frequently check the IMS V15.03.00 PSP Bucket for HIPER and SPECIAL attention PTFs against all FMIDs that you must install. You can also receive the latest HOLDDATA, then add the **FIXCAT(IBM.PRODUCTINSTALL-REQUIRESERVICE)** operand on your **APPLY CHECK** command. This will allow you to review the recommended and critical service that should be installed with your FMIDs.

5.0 Installation Requirements and Considerations

The following sections identify the system requirements for installing and activating IMS V15.03.00. The following terminology is used:

- *Driving system*: the system on which SMP/E is executed to install the program.
The program might have specific operating system or product level requirements for using processes, such as binder or assembly utilities during the installation.
- *Target system*: the system on which the program is configured and run.
The program might have specific product level requirements, such as needing access to the library of another product for link-edits. These requirements, either mandatory or optional, might directly affect the element during the installation or in its basic or enhanced operation.

In many cases, you can use a system as both a driving system and a target system. However, you can make a separate IPL-able clone of the running system to use as a target system. The clone must include copies of all system libraries that SMP/E updates, copies of the SMP/E CSI data sets that describe the system libraries, and your PARMLIB and PROCLIB.

Use separate driving and target systems in the following situations:

- When you install a new level of a product that is already installed, the new level of the product will replace the old one. By installing the new level onto a separate target system, you can test the new level and keep the old one in production at the same time.
- When you install a product that shares libraries or load modules with other products, the installation can disrupt the other products. By installing the product onto a separate target system, you can assess these impacts without disrupting your production system.

5.1 Driving System Requirements

This section describes the environment of the driving system required to install IMS V15.03.00.

5.1.1 Machine Requirements

The driving system can run in any hardware environment that supports the required software.

5.2 Target System Requirements

This section describes the environment of the target system required to install and use IMS V15.03.00.

IMS V15.03.00 installs in the DBS (P115) SREL.

5.2.1 Machine Requirements

Although the target system can run in any hardware environment that supports the required software, IMS V15.03.00 operates on IBM System z10 or higher processors capable of running z/OS 2.3.0, or later.

Sysplex data sharing (including data caching and VSO data sharing) with Internal Resource Lock Manager (IRLM) 2.3 requires a coupling facility level 15 or later. Shared queues, shared-EMH support require a coupling facility level 15 or later. OM Audit Trail requires a coupling facility level of 15 or later if a coupling facility log stream is used. Repository Server Audit Log requires a coupling facility level of 15 or later if a coupling facility log stream is used. Resource Manager (RM) requires a coupling facility level of 15 or later if a resource structure is used.

IMS 15.3 is the last IMS release that supports coupling facility levels associated with IBM z10 EC, z10 BC, z196, and z114 processor types (CF levels 15 through 17).

When the Multiple Systems Coupling (MSC) physical link is channel-to-channel and is dedicated to IMS, MSC requires the System/370 CTC adapter or a logical channel on the IBM 3088, ESCON, or fiber channel connection (FICON). MSC FICON CTC support requires that at least one IMS system be installed on an IBM zSeries machine with the FICON channel and FICON CTC microcode. The other side (IMS) can be any processor with a FICON channel.

Database Image Copy Fast Replication support requires the fast replication feature of DFSMS, which requires either the FlashCopy feature of the IBM Enterprise Storage Server (ESS), or the Snapshot feature of the IBMRAMAC Virtual Array (RVA) storage system. For all other system libraries and working storage space, any device supported by the operating system is allowed.

5.2.2 Programming Requirements

5.2.2.1 Installation Requisites

Installation requisites identify products that are required and *must* be present on the system or products that are not required but *should* be present on the system for the successful installation of this product.

Mandatory installation requisites identify products that are required on the system for the successful installation of this product. These products are specified as PREs or REQs.

IMS V15.03.00 has no mandatory installation requisites.

Conditional installation requisites identify products that are *not* required for successful installation of this product but can resolve such things as certain warning messages at installation time. These products are specified as IF REQs.

IMS V15.03.00 has no conditional installation requisites.

5.2.2.2 Operational Requisites

Operational requisites are products that are required and *must* be present on the system or products that are not required but *should* be present on the system for this product to operate all or part of its functions.

Mandatory operational requisites identify products that are required for this product to operate its basic functions.

5.3 FMIDs Deleted

Installing IMS V15.03.00 might result in the deletion of other FMIDs. To see which FMIDs will be deleted, examine the ++VER statement in the SMPMCS of the product.

If you do not want to delete these FMIDs at this time, install IMS V15.03.00 into separate SMP/E target and distribution zones.

Note: These FMIDs are not automatically deleted from the Global Zone. If you want to delete these FMIDs from the Global Zone, use the SMP/E REJECT NOFMID DELETEFMID command. See the SMP/E Commands book for details.

5.4 Special Considerations

IMS V15.03.00 has no special considerations for the target system.

6.0 Installation Instructions

This chapter describes the installation method and the step-by-step procedures to install and to activate the functions of IMS V15.03.00.

Please note the following points:

- If you want to install IMS V15.03.00 into its own SMP/E environment, consult the SMP/E manuals for instructions on creating and initializing the SMP/CSI and the SMP/E control data sets.
- You can use the sample jobs that are provided to perform part or all of the installation tasks. The SMP/E jobs assume that all DDDEF entries that are required for SMP/E execution have been defined in appropriate zones.
- You can use the SMP/E dialogs instead of the sample jobs to accomplish the SMP/E installation steps.

6.1 Installing IMS V15.03.00

6.1.1 SMP/E Considerations for Installing IMS V15.03.00

Use the SMP/E RECEIVE, APPLY, and ACCEPT commands to install this release of IMS V15.03.00.

6.1.2 SMP/E Options Subentry Values

The recommended values for certain SMP/E CSI subentries are shown in Figure 21. Using values lower than the recommended values can result in failures in the installation. DSSPACE is a subentry in the GLOBAL options entry. PEMAX is a subentry of the GENERAL entry in the GLOBAL options entry. See the SMP/E manuals for instructions on updating the global zone.

Note: CALLLIBS uses the previous DDDEFs only to resolve the link-edit for IMS V15.03.00. These data sets are not updated during the installation of IMS V15.03.00.

6.1.5 Allocate SMP/E CSI (Optional)

If you are using an existing CSI, do not execute this job.

If you are allocating a new SMP/E data set for this install, edit and submit sample job **DFSALA** to allocate the SMP/E data set for IMS V15.03.00. Consult the instructions in the sample job for more information.

Expected Return Codes and Messages: You will receive a return code of 0 if this job runs correctly.

6.1.6 Initialize CSI zones (Optional)

If you are using an existing CSI with its SMP/E zones already initialized, **do not** execute this job.

Note: If you do not run the optional jobs to set up your CSI, do the following:

- You must set the PEMAX value to its SMP/E default. If not, you might get error messages of GIM25901E during SMP/E processing.
- You must set the ACCJCLIN indicator in the distribution zone prior to running the SMP/E ACCEPT processing. **GENERATE processing, as documented in the process described in informational**

APAR II13024, will not run properly without it. This will cause entries produced from JCLIN to be saved in the distribution zone whenever a SYSMOD containing inline JCLIN is ACCEPTed. For more information on the ACCJCLIN indicator, see the description of inline JCLIN in the SMP/E manuals.

- As IMS Value Unit Edition now distributes most of its libraries in PDSE format, your SMPLTS **MUST** be a PDSE.

Note: If you have an existing SMPLTS which is not a PDSE, you will need to allocate a new PDSE and copy your existing SMPLTS into it. Then change your SMPLTS DDDEF entry to indicate the new PDSE data set.

- **Suggestion:** Create separate SMP/E UTILITY entries for both the binder (linkage editor) and assembler (ASMA90) because the system default might not be the best selection for IMS.

These UTILITY entries should have the following characteristics:

Binder - The highest acceptable return code from the binder for APPLY processing is 0 and for ACCEPT processing is 4. Separate SMP/E OPTIONS entries are needed to point to these different SMP/E UTILITY entries.

Assembler - The assembler utility should contain the following entry:

Tip: IMS requires the NODBCS setting for assemblies. If the assembler is installed to use double-byte character set (DBCS) as the default, the NODBCS parameter must be specified in the SMP/E UTILITY entry.

Edit and submit sample job **DFSALB** to initialize SMP/E zones for IMS V15.03.00. Consult the instructions in the sample job for more information.

Expected Return Codes and Messages: You will receive a **return code of 0** if this job runs correctly.

6.1.7 Perform SMP/E RECEIVE

If you have obtained IMS V15.03.00 as part of a CBPDO, use the RCVPDO job in the CBPDO RIMLIB data set to receive the IMS V15.03.00 FMIDs, service, and HOLDDATA that are included on the CBPDO package. For more information, see the documentation that is included in the CBPDO.

6.1.8 Allocate SMP/E Target and Distribution Libraries

Edit and submit sample job **DFSALOC1** to allocate the SMP/E target and distribution libraries for IMS V15.03.00. Consult the instructions in the sample job for more information.

Expected Return Codes and Messages: You will receive a return code of 0 if this job runs correctly.

If you are installing the IMS Java On Demand feature, edit and submit the sample job **DFSALOC2** to allocate the SMP/E target and distribution libraries for this feature. Consult the instructions in the sample job for more information.

Expected Return Codes and Messages: You will receive a return code of 0 if this job runs correctly.

6.1.9 Allocate, create and mount ZFS Files for z/OS Workload Interaction Correlator & Java On Demand Feature

The recommended z/OS UNIX file system type is *zFS*.

The sample jobs in this section perform the following tasks for z/OS Workload Interaction Correlator and Optional Java On Demand feature.

- Create a mount point
- Mount the z/OS UNIX file system on the mount point
- Create the z/OS UNIX file system paths

6.1.9.1 Allocate, create and mount zFS Files for z/OS Workload Interaction Correlator

The recommended mount point for z/OS Workload Interaction Correlator is */usr/lpp/ims/ims15core*.

The sample job **DFSWCZFS** will perform the following tasks:

- Create a mount point
- Mount the z/OS UNIX file system on the mount point

Edit and submit **DFSWCZFS**. Consult the instructions in the sample jobs for more information.

DFSWCZFS defines the mountpoint as follows:

- Mount the z/OS UNIX file system on the mountpoint

Edit and submit **DFSALZFS** Consult the instructions in the sample job for more information.

DFSALZFS defines the mountpoint for Java On Demand feature as follows:

```
MOUNT FILESYSTEM('#dsn')
MOUNTPOINT('/usr/lpp/ims/ims15')
MODE(RDWR) /* can be MODE(READ) */
TYPE(ZFS) PARM('AGGRGROW') /* zFS, with extents */

#dsn is the name of the data set holding the z/OS UNIX file system.

/usr/lpp/ims/ims15 is the name of the mount point where the z/OS UNIX file system will be mounted for Java On Demand feature.

Expected Return Codes and Messages: You will receive a return code of 0 if this job runs correctly.

6.1.10 Allocate File System Paths for z/OS Workload Interaction Correlator and Java On Demand Feature

Before running the sample job to create the z/OS UNIX file system, you must ensure that OMVS is active on the driving system. zFS must be active on the driving system when you are installing the support for z/OS Workload Interaction Correlator and optionally, IMS Java On Demand feature. into a file system that is zFS.

If you create a new file system for this product, consider updating the BPXPRMxx PARMLIB member to mount the new file system at IPL time. This action can be helpful if an IPL occurs before the installation is completed.

6.1.10.1 Allocate File System Paths for z/OS Workload Interaction Correlator

DFSWMKMD and **DFSWMKDR** will create the additional UNIX file system paths required for z/OS Workload Interaction Correlator.

Edit and submit sample job **DFSWSMKD** to allocate the zFS paths for z/OS Workload Interaction Correlator. This job will call **DFSWMKDR** to create the additional file system paths described above.

Consult the instructions in the sample job for more information.

The target file system data set must be mounted on the driving system when running the sample **DFSWSMKD** job since the job will create paths in the zFS.

Expected Return Codes and Messages: You will receive a return code of 0 if this job runs correctly.

6.1.10.2 Allocate File System Paths for IMS Java On Demand feature

If you plan to install Java On Demand feature into a new zFS file system, **DFSJSMKD** and **DFSJMKDR** will create the additional UNIX file system paths required for IMS Java On Demand feature.

Edit and submit sample job **DFSJSMKD** to allocate the zFS paths for Java On Demand feature. This job will call **DFSJMKDR** to create the additional file system paths described above.

Consult the instructions in the sample job for more information.

The target file system data set must be mounted on the driving system when running the sample **DFSJSMKD** job since the job will create paths in the zFS.

Expected Return Codes and Messages: You will receive a return code of 0 if this job runs correctly.

6.1.11 Create DDDEF Entries

Edit and submit sample job **DFSDDEF1** to create DDDEF entries for the SMP/E target and distribution libraries for IMS V15.03.00. Consult the instructions in the sample job for more information.

Expected Return Codes and Messages: You will receive a return code of 0 if this job runs correctly.

If you are installing IMS Java On Demand feature, edit and submit sample job **DFSDDEF2** to create DDDEF entries for the SMP/E target and distribution libraries. Consult the instructions in the sample job for more information.

Expected Return Codes and Messages: You will receive a return code of 0 if this job runs correctly.

6.1.12 Perform SMP/E APPLY

1. Ensure that you have the latest HOLDDATA; then edit and submit sample job **DFSAPPLY** to perform an SMP/E APPLY CHECK for IMS V15.03.00. Consult the instructions in the sample job for more information.

The latest HOLDDATA is available through several different portals, including <http://service.software.ibm.com/holddata/390holddata.html>. The latest HOLDDATA may identify HIPER and FIXCAT APARs for the FMIDs you will be installing. An APPLY CHECK will help you determine if any HIPER or FIXCAT APARs are applicable to the FMIDs you are installing. If there are any applicable HIPER or FIXCAT APARs, the APPLY CHECK will also identify fixing PTFs that will resolve the APARs, if a fixing PTF is available.

You should install the FMIDs regardless of the status of unresolved HIPER or FIXCAT APARs. However, do not deploy the software until the unresolved HIPER and FIXCAT APARs have been analyzed to determine their applicability. That is, before deploying the software either ensure fixing PTFs are applied to resolve all HIPER or FIXCAT APARs, or ensure the problems reported by all HIPER or FIXCAT APARs are not applicable to your environment.

To receive the full benefit of the SMP/E Causer SYSMOD Summary Report, do *not* bypass the PRE, ID, REQ, and IFREQ on the APPLY CHECK. The SMP/E root cause analysis identifies the cause only of *errors* and not of *warnings* (SMP/E treats bypassed PRE, ID, REQ, and IFREQ conditions as warnings, instead of errors).

Here are sample APPLY commands:

- a. To ensure that all recommended and critical service is installed with the FMIDs, receive the latest HOLDDATA and use the APPLY CHECK command as follows

```
APPLY S(fmid,fmid,...) CHECK
FORFMID(fmid,fmid,...)
SOURCEID(RSU*)
FIXCAT(IBM.ProductInstall-RequiredService)
GROUPEXTEND .
```

Some HIPER APARs might not have fixing PTFs available yet. You should analyze the symptom flags for the unresolved HIPER APARs to determine if the reported problem is applicable to your environment and if you should bypass the specific ERROR HOLDS in order to continue the installation of the FMIDs.

This method requires more initial research, but can provide resolution for all HIPERs that have fixing PTFs available and are not in a PE chain. Unresolved PEs or HIPERs might still exist and require the use of BYPASS.

- b. To install the FMIDs without regard for unresolved HIPER APARs, you can add the BYPASS(HOLDCLASS(HIPER)) operand to the APPLY CHECK command. This will allow you to install FMIDs even though one or more unresolved HIPER APARs exist. After the FMIDs are installed, use the SMP/E REPORT ERRSYSMODS command to identify unresolved HIPER APARs and any fixing PTFs.

```
APPLY S(fmid,fmid,...) CHECK
FORFMID(fmid,fmid,...)
SOURCEID(RSU*)
FIXCAT(IBM.ProductInstall-RequiredService)
GROUPEXTEND
BYPASS(HOLDCLASS(HIPER)) .
..any other parameters documented in the program directory
```

This method is quicker, but requires subsequent review of the Exception SYSMOD report produced by the REPORT ERRSYSMODS command to investigate any unresolved HIPERs. If you have received the latest HOLDDATA, you can also choose to use the REPORT MISSINGFIX command and specify Fix Category IBM.PRODUCTINSTALL-REQUIREDSERVICE to investigate missing recommended service.

If you bypass HOLDDs during the installation of the FMIDs because fixing PTFs are not yet available, you can be notified when the fixing PTFs are available by using the APAR Status Tracking (AST) function of ServiceLink or the APAR Tracking function of ResourceLink.

2. After you take actions that are indicated by the APPLY CHECK, remove the CHECK operand and run the job again to perform the APPLY.

Note: The GROUPEXTEND operand indicates that SMP/E applies all requisite SYSMODs. The requisite SYSMODS might be applicable to other functions.

Expected Return Codes and Messages from APPLY CHECK: You will receive a **return code of 4** if this job runs correctly. The following messages can be ignored: GIM43401W, GIM44402W, and GIM61903W.

Note: All 'NOT SEL' messages in the ELEMENT SUMMARY REPORT are expected and can be ignored.

Expected Return Codes and Messages from APPLY: You will receive a **return code of 4** if this job runs correctly. The following messages can be ignored: GIM43401W, GIM44402W, and GIM61903W.

Note: All 'NOT SEL' messages in the ELEMENT SUMMARY REPORT are expected and can be ignored.

If PTFs containing SYSTEM HOLDDATA are being applied, SMP/E APPLY processing will indicate the subject HOLDDATA is bypassed, resulting in a return code of 4 from the APPLY step. These messages do not affect the success of the APPLY step and can be ignored, however, you must take any action described by the HOLDDATA.

Note: The processing of applying IMS Java On Demand feature, FMID JMK1506, will automatically invoke UNIX shell scripts (SHELLSCRs) that will issue commands as required.

If PTFs containing SYSTEM HOLDDATA are being applied, SMP/E APPLY processing will indicate the subject HOLDDATA is bypassed, resulting in a return code of 4 from the APPLY step. These messages do not affect the success of the APPLY step and can be ignored, however, you must take any action described by the HOLDDATA.

6.1.13 Perform SMP/E ACCEPT

Edit and submit sample job **DFSACCEP** to perform an SMP/E ACCEPT CHECK for IMS V15.03.00. Consult the instructions in the sample job for more information.

To receive the full benefit of the SMP/E Causer SYSMOD Summary Report, do *not* bypass the PRE, ID, REQ, and IFREQ on the ACCEPT CHECK. The SMP/E root cause analysis identifies the cause of *errors* but not *warnings* (SMP/E treats bypassed PRE, ID, REQ, and IFREQ conditions as warnings rather than errors).

Before you use SMP/E to load new distribution libraries, it is recommended that you set the ACCJCLIN indicator in the distribution zone. In this way, you can save the entries that are produced from JCLIN in the distribution zone whenever a SYSMOD that contains inline JCLIN is accepted. For more information about the ACCJCLIN indicator, see the description of inline JCLIN in the SMP/E Commands book for details.

After you take actions that are indicated by the ACCEPT CHECK, remove the CHECK operand and run the job again to perform the ACCEPT.

Note: The GROUPEXTEND operand indicates that SMP/E accepts all requisite SYSMODs. The requisite SYSMODS might be applicable to other functions.

Expected Return Codes and Messages from ACCEPT CHECK: If no PTFs are being accepted and if this job runs correctly, you will receive a **return code of 0**. If PTFs are being accepted and if this job runs correctly, you will receive a **return code of 4**.

If PTFs that contain replacement modules are accepted, SMP/E ACCEPT processing will link-edit or bind the modules into the distribution libraries. During this processing, the Linkage Editor or Binder might issue messages that indicate unresolved external references, which will result in a return code of 4 during the ACCEPT phase. You can ignore these messages, because the distribution libraries are not executable and the unresolved external references do not affect the executable system libraries.

The following message can be ignored: GIM61903W.

Expected Return Codes and Messages from ACCEPT: You will receive a return code of 0 if this job runs correctly and no PTFs are being accepted.

If PTFs are being accepted and if this job runs correctly, you will receive a **return code of 4**.

6.1.14 Copy Sample Procedures

Beginning with IMS V15.03.00 the IMS SYSGEN process no longer creates the sample IMS procedures that are used as input to the various IMS utilities. The IMS procedures are now copied into the target library SDFSPROC during the SMP/E install.

A sample job DFSPROCB is provided in SDFSBASE which can be used to copy the sample procedures to a site specific procedure library. Consult the instructions in the sample job for more information.

6.1.15 Run REPORT CROSSZONE

The SMP/E REPORT CROSSZONE command identifies requisites for products that are installed in separate zones. This command also creates APPLY and ACCEPT commands in the SMPPUNCH data set. You can use the APPLY and ACCEPT commands to install those cross-zone requisites that the SMP/E REPORT CROSSZONE command identifies.

After you install IMS V15.03.00, it is recommended that you run REPORT CROSSZONE against the new or updated target and distribution zones. REPORT CROSSZONE requires a global zone with ZONEINDEX entries that describe all the target and distribution libraries to be reported on.

For more information about REPORT CROSSZONE, see the SMP/E manuals.
